**Md. Rule 17-205 provides for basic mediation qualifications (in part, 40-hour basic mediation training and 4 hours of annual mediation-related CEU); additional training (20 hours) in divorce property and annulment cases; and additional actual case mediation experience for cases involving business & technology, and health care malpractice cases.

***Md. Rule 9-205 provides for training requirements in addition to Md. Rule 12-207, in the mediation of child custody matters (in part, 20 hours of family mediation training).
